What does IWD mean to you? Ran Oren: "IWD resonates with Respect, one of our Group values. Women should be respected, celebrated and given equal opportunities to men in all our communities; whether at work or in social or family environments."

What are the most effective ways to counteract the negative stereotypes of feminism, especially in the workplace?

R.O: "Education and listening. Feminism should not be negative, in my view it is a simple concept: equality. Females should have equal rights to men – to education, to work, to access public services, to enjoy freedoms... There should be no differentiation between males and females and IWD is another opportunity to remind ourselves of this and seek to address any conscious or unconscious bias we may have."

Why do you support women's empowerment and gender equality?

Jan Vanderstraeten: "I believe any person, men or women, should be able to be all - he or she - wants to be in life. There is nothing more inspiring and rewarding then to persue your dreams. Gender equality seems simple on the surface. However, it is a complex issue. I aim to contribute wherever and whenever I can. That is why I am a strong advocate of promoting gender equality and strengthening women's rights. Achieving gender equality can be accelerated through women's empowerment. In my role within Altrad, I am able to make a difference. That is why I will not hesitate to make it happen."

What progress have you seen on gender equality in your life and work?

J.V: "Despite many of the advances towards gender equality in the past years, progress remains rather slow in many regions. We have to recognize that. So if you read this, wherever you are: it all starts within your own environment. I have been part of a number of working environments in the past. The most performing and best functioning teams included women. If only we would be able to recognize more of the advantages of having mixed teams, we should be able to progress faster."

Share a women's empowerment moment that inspired you.

R.O: "There are so many, from women leaders on the world stage (Finland's women-led cabinet, Karmala Harris' election as Vice-President, Jacinda Ardern...) to those within Altrad, be they holding senior management positions or carrying out supervisory or operational roles historically done exclusively by men."
